

**ROSES OF THE GOLDEN WEST  
2016 ROSE SHOW  
OCTOBER 1, 2016**

**Division I - Horticulture**

**Rules**

1. Exhibitors must be registered for the convention.
2. Entries are judged by ARS accredited judges according to the *ARS Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses* and other show conditions set forth in this schedule. Particular attention should be paid to reasons for disqualification as listed in these guidelines. Show judges (horticulture and arrangement) are not eligible to enter the division they are judging except in Section F (Horticulture) designated for judges. Arrangement judges may enter in the Horticulture Division and Horticulture judges may enter in the Arrangement Division.
3. The rose show prep area will be open from 4:00 p.m. Friday, September 30<sup>th</sup> to 11:00 p.m. Saturday, October 1st. **Entries will be received from 7:00 a.m. to 9:45 a.m., Saturday, October 1, 2016.** Only one exhibitor or team per garden is permitted and roses must be outdoor grown. **There is NO placement committee – it is up to the exhibitor to enter their roses in the correct class.** Judging will commence at 10:00 a.m. The decision of the judges is final. **The show committee will furnish all containers except English Boxes, bowls, and heavy vases for large entries, which must be supplied by the exhibitor.** Each entry must be accompanied by securely folded ARS entry tag(s) completed with Class, Variety, and the exhibitor name(s), and address. Both top and bottom portions of the entry tag must be completed. Please use only pencil, indelible ink, stamp or name labels. **The rose show will be broken down starting at 4:00 p.m on Saturday, October 1, 2016. All exhibits must be removed by 5:00 p.m.**
4. Wedges and supports are permitted. However, an entry may be penalized if wedging extends above the lip of the vase according to the degree of distraction.
5. Horticulture Division entries will be disqualified for the following reasons:
  - a. Misnamed, misclassified, misplaced by the exhibitor, unlabeled, or mislabeled. **There is NO placement committee – it is up to the exhibitor to enter their roses in the correct class.**

- b. Stem-on-stem – a specimen exhibited with a portion of the previous stem growth attached. Exceptions: species, Old Garden Roses, and shrubs may be shown stem-on-stem.
  - c. Presence of foreign substance applied to the foliage, stem or bloom to improve the appearance of the specimen.
  - d. Not disbudded. Any class calling for one-bloom-per-stem specimens must be exhibited without side buds. A side bud is defined as growth emanating from a leaf axil having sufficient maturity to display the formation of a stem with or without flower buds. The presence of one or two leaflets or leaves at the leaf axil with no evidence of a stem is cause for penalization but not disqualification. Exception: species, Old Garden Rose, climber, and shrub one-bloom-per-stem specimens may be shown with side buds. An exhibitor may remove unwanted growth subject to possible penalization.
  - e. An entry in violation of ARS rules or local society rules applying to this show.
  - f. Any rose that has been entered with a name that has not been recognized by American Rose Society will be disqualified. Roses are to be exhibited by the recognized ARS exhibition name (AEN).
6. Classes that state “large” roses means any class of rose other than a miniature or miniflora rose – grandifloras, floribundas, shrubs, OGRs, climbers and polyanthas.
  7. A spray is defined as a “group of florets on one main or lateral stem with at least two or more blooms.”
  8. With the exception of seedlings and sports, rose varieties exhibited must be entered under the approved exhibition name adopted by the American Rose Society as listed in any one of the following official ARS publications: *Modern Roses 12* (book and database), *The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges and Exhibitors*, *The Handbook for Selecting Roses*, or “Recent Registrations” on the ARS website. In cases where a variety is not listed in any of the above ARS publications, a listing in the *Combined Rose List* is acceptable.
  9. With the exception of Challenge Classes and classes specifying multiple varieties, all roses in each class will be placed alphabetically and each variety in each class shall constitute a separate class to be judged separately. An exhibitor may enter as many blooms in Section C, D, E, &F as desired, provided that the entries within each class are different varieties (one of each variety allowed). In section A & B, one entry per class is permitted.

Exhibitors shall be allowed to place their entries in all classes (Sections A - F) without restriction, other than space allowed.

ARS Certificates and District Trophies will be awarded as set forth in the show schedule.

## **SECTION A**

### **NCNH DISTRICT CHALLENGE CLASSES**

*Open only to ARS members within the NCNH District. One entry per class per exhibitor. Each container must have a separate entry tag*

**Class 1 – J. Horace McFarland Memorial Trophy** – Six (6) hybrid teas and/or grandifloras, without side buds, each a different variety, exhibited in separate containers [width allowed 30”]

**Class 2 – Edwin and Darley Lisherness Trophy** - Three (3) white hybrid teas, without side buds, any combination of varieties, exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 3 – Dr. D. Jay Nichols Trophy** – Three (3) light, medium, deep yellow, or yellow blend (ly, my, dy, yb) hybrid teas. without side buds, One (1) variety or three (3) different varieties exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 4 – Captain Harry Stebbings Trophy** – Three (3) light, medium, or deep pink (lp, mp, dp) hybrid teas, without side buds, any combination of varieties, exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 5 – Clyde H. Stocking Memorial Trophy** – Three (3) pink blend hybrid teas, without side buds. One (1) variety or Three (3) different varieties exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 6 – Alfred Leloy Jr. Memorial Trophy** – Three (3) medium red or dark red hybrid teas, without side buds. One (1) variety or three (3) different varieties exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 7 – Dr. Ron Brooks Perpetual Trophy** – Three (3) different varieties of hybrid teas, without side buds, introduced within the last five years (2011-2016) and exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 8 – Esther K. Hughes “Peace” Trophy** – One (1) specimen of any hybrid tea containing “Peace” in its name, without side buds.

**Class 9 – American Rose Foundation Windsounds Trophy** – Hybrid Tea Cycle of Bloom. Three (3) hybrid teas of the same variety – a bud with sepals down and petals unfurling, an exhibition stage bloom, one half to three quarters open, and a fully open bloom with stamens showing – exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 10 – Baptiste Michelis Memorial Trophy** – Three (3) stems consisting of one hybrid tea (without side buds), one grandiflora (without side buds), and one floribunda spray. Exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 11 – Richard Tyson Memorial Trophy** – Five (5) stems consisting of three (3) hybrid teas (without side buds) and two (2) floribunda sprays exhibited in separate containers. Any combination of varieties. [Width allowed 30”]

**Class 12 – J. Harvey Brown Perpetual Trophy** – Three (3) floribunda sprays, one (1) variety or three (3) different varieties exhibited in separate containers. [Width allowed 25”]

**Class 13 – Ramona Stocking Trophy** – One (1) floribunda spray, any variety.

**Class 14 – All American Rose Selections Challenge Class** Three (3) stems of different AARS winners – any types – exhibited in separate containers. All one bloom per stem entries, except shrubs, must be shown without side buds.

**Class 15 – Clementina Monteleone Perpetual Trophy** – One (1) specimen of any class of a fragrant dark or medium red rose with exhibition form, without side buds.

**Class 16 – Laura Sutter Memorial Trophy** – Three (3) mauve or mauve blend roses. Three (3) different varieties of any type exhibited in separate containers.

**Class 17 – Bill and Muriel Humenick Trophy** – Three (3) stems of any type of ‘blend’ rose, three (3) different varieties. The exhibit may be staged in one (1) container or three (3) separate containers; the choice is the exhibitor’s. [*Eligible ARS color classes are: yb, ab, ob, pb, rb*]

**Class 18 – Annette Dobbs Trophy** – One (1) stem of any type single rose (4-8) petals. One bloom per stem or one spray.

**Class 19 – District Directors Miniflora Rose Trophy** – Five (5) Miniflora blooms of exhibition form, each a different variety, exhibited in separate containers.  
*District Directors Trophy in Memory of J. Benjamin Williams*

**Class 20 – Clay Morgan District Trophy** – English style box of six (6) hybrid tea or grandiflora roses, no more than two (2) of any variety. Box provided by exhibitor  
*Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 21 – Dr. Howard I. Gallagher Memorial Trophy** – Miniature English style box of six (6) different miniature varieties. No minifloras. Box provided by exhibitor. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 22 – Ralph S. Moore Trophy** – Seven (7) miniature roses, each a different variety, exhibited in separate containers. [Width allowed 24”]

*Note: Judges judging this show who wish to enter the NCNH DISTRICT CHALLENGE classes above may do so by choosing to not judge any of these classes. They must notify Judge Chair Linda Burg by September 23, 2016*

## SECTION B

### NCNH LOCAL SHOW

#### OPEN CHALLENGE CLASSES

**Class 23 – Large Rose in a Bowl** – Any large rose (any rose other than Miniature or Miniflora) at its most perfect phase of beauty, in a bowl provided by the exhibitor. One detached leaf is optional. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 24 – Miniflora Rose in a Bowl** – Any miniflora rose, at its most perfect phase of beauty, in a bowl provided by the exhibitor. One detached leaf is optional. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 25 – Miniature Rose in a Bowl** – Any miniature rose, at its most perfect phase of beauty, in a bowl provided by the exhibitor. One detached leaf is optional. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 26 – Trailing Rose** – One stem of a trailing rose (those roses that have a more relaxed growing habit with multiple blooms that look toward the side rather than upward at the end of the stem), any variety. Exhibited in an orchid tube, on a dinner napkin size piece of cloth, lying on the table. Cloth and orchid tube provided by exhibitor.

**Class 27 – Rose in a Picture Frame** – Any rose at its most perfect phase of beauty. Bloom should be in proportion to frame size. Frame may be provided by the exhibitor. Some frames (8x10 & 5x7) will be available on a first come basis.

**Class 28 – Hi-Lo** - two specimens, one of a larger rose and one of a smaller rose, matched for form, color, and degree of openness. Stem length of large specimen may be shortened for a more pleasing appearance. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 29 – Large Rose Bouquet** – A bouquet of at least 12 stems of any large roses, any combination of types and varieties. Exhibitor to provide vase.

**Class 30 – Miniature/Miniflora Bouquet** – A bouquet of at least 12 stems of any Miniature/Miniflora roses, any combination of types and varieties. Exhibitor to provide vase.

## Section C

### HORTICULTURE SPECIMENS

#### Hybrid Tea and Grandiflora

**Class 31 – Hybrid Tea and Grandiflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage. *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates. Court of Honor to consist of 5 runners up.*

**Class 32 – Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Spray** – One spray. *Eligible for ARS Best Hybrid Tea Spray & Best Grandiflora Spray Certificates. Both certificates may be awarded if warranted.*

**Class 33 – Single Large Rose** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. Any rose having 4 to 8 petals or of a variety classed as a single by the American Rose society. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 34 – Open Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Bloom** – One open bloom per stem, without side buds, stamens visible. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

#### Floribunda

**Class 35 – Floribunda Spray** – One spray. *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates. Court of Honor to consist of 5 runners up*

**Class 36 – Floribunda** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, at its most perfect phase of beauty. *Eligible for ARS Certificate. .*

#### Polyantha

**Class 37 – Polyantha Spray** – One spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

## **Miniature**

**Class 38 – Miniatures** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage. *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates. Court of Honor to consist of 5 runners up.*

**Class 39 – Miniature Spray** – One spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

**Class 40 – Single Miniature** – One bloom per stem, without side buds. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

**Class 41 – Open Miniature** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, stamens visible. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

## **Miniflora**

**Class 42 – Miniflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage. *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates. Court of Honor to consist of 5 runners up.*

**Class 43 – Miniflora Spray** – One spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

**Class 44 - Single Miniflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Class 45 - Open Miniflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, stamens visible. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

## **Climbers**

**Class 46 – Climbers** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

## **Seedlings and Sports**

**Seedlings** – An original specimen hybridized by the exhibitor. Parents of the seedling should be noted on the entry tag as well as the type of rose. If parentage is unknown, indicate unknown.

**Sport** – An unregistered mutation of a variety resulting in a new variety grown by the exhibitor. Original rose should be noted on the entry tag as well as the type of rose.

**Class 47 – Seedling or Sport** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate*

**Classic Shrub – Hybrid Rugosa, Hybrid Kordesii, Hybrid Moyesii, and Hybrid Musk only**

**Class 48 – Classic Shrub** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

**Modern Shrub Roses** – Marked S in *The Handbook for Selecting Rose*.

**Class 49 – Modern Shrub** - One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Certificate.*

**Old Garden Roses** – Check approved ARS references for date of introduction. Date of introduction **must** appear on entry tag.

**Class 50 – Species** – Any rose designated as species (Sp) in any ARS publication. One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Genesis Certificate*

**Class 51 – OGR Introduced Prior to 1867** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Dowager Queen Certificate*

**Class 52 – OGR Introduced 1867 and Later** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray. *Eligible for ARS Victorian Certificate.*

### **Section D Novice**

*Open to those who have not won an award in an ARS sanctioned show. Best of each class eligible to compete for certificates in corresponding classes - Eligible for ARS Best Novice Certificate*

**Class 53 – Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage. Best of Class *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates with Class 31.*

**Class 54 – Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Spray** – One spray. *Eligible for Certificate with Class 32*

**Class 55 – Floribunda Spray** – One spray. Best of Class *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates with Class 35*

**Class 56 – Floribunda** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, at its most perfect phase of beauty.*Eligible for Certificate with Class 36*

**Class 57 - Miniature** – One Bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage. Best of Class *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates with Class 38.*

**Class 58 – Miniature Spray** – One spray.*Eligible for Certificate with Class39*

**Class 59 – Miniflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage. Best of Class *Eligible for ARS Gold, Silver and Bronze Certificates with Class 42.*

**Class 60 – Miniflora Spray** – One spray.*Eligible for Certificate with Class 43*

### **Section E Junior**

*Open to those age 17 and younger and registered for this convention. Best Bloom from Class 61-62 Eligible for ARS Best Junior Bloom Certificate. Best Spray from Class 61-62 Eligible for ARS Best Junior Spray Certificate*

**Class 61 – Any Large Flowered Rose** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray.

**Class 62 – Any Miniature or Miniflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage, or one spray.

### **Section F Judges**

*Open to those judges judging this show. Class 63-72 – Eligible for ARS Best Judges Certificate*

**Class 63 – Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage.

**Class 64 – Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Spray** – One spray

**Class 65 – Floribunda** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, at its most perfect phase of beauty.

**Class 66 – Floribunda Spray** – One spray

**Class 67 - Miniature** – One Bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage.

**Class 68 – Miniature Spray** – One spray.

**Class 69 – Miniflora** – One bloom per stem, without side buds, exhibition stage.

**Class 70 – Miniflora Spray** – One spray.

**Class 71 – Shrub** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray.

**Class 72 – Old Garden Rose** – One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray.

**Class 73 – Any Other Rose -** One bloom per stem, with or without side buds, or one spray.
